“You can’t change the whole world, but you can change the whole world for one child.” That’s the heart of each foster family we work with at Families 4 Families — and it’s our heart, too.

Each of the 11,438 in the Georgia foster care system has a name and a story — and we need your help this season to provide more children with the gift of a godly home. Families like the Whites, a couple who chose to step out in faith and meet the call to foster, need your support.

In March 2020, as the world was shutting down, Matthew and Beth White took in their first placements, hosting them for one week. Since then, the Whites have fostered 10 children — with the most recent staying in their home for 32 months.

Through each unique situation, the Whites have felt supported by Families 4 Families.

“Families 4 Families caseworkers are responsive, ethical and always focused on doing what’s best for the children. Our caseworkers Kimberly and Sarah have even come to court hearings with us,” he said. **“Families 4 Families walks hand in hand with foster parents so these children are as successful as possible while in our care.”**

Matthew and Beth have seen children’s lives and futures changed for the better.

“One of our placements is now six years old and has level 2 autism. He is one of the sweetest kids you’ll ever meet — he told us every day how much he loved us — but he needs a lot of support and help,” Matthew said. *“[After being reunited] not only did his bio mom recognize what he needs, but she has continued to work to get him needed resources and help.”*

The Whites accepted the call to open their home, but they recognize each person’s calling to foster care is different and essential to caring for children in need — including donors.

“Those who financially support are just as important as we are with our home open. Donors help Families 4 Families to do what they do so that we can be focused on the day-to-day with these children,” Matthew said.

This year has been a testimony of His provision. While giving has slowed across the country, we’ve made our biggest impact yet. *Thanks to your generosity, more children and families have been served than ever before — and we’re not done.*
